The site has a small borrow pond where visitors can enjoy some bank fishing. A short trail leads you into an old oak hammock. You may see turkeys and deer during your visit and possibly a scrambling Sherman's fox squirrel

FIND THE CACHE WITHOUT GPS:

After parking, continue through the walk through. Follow the trail counter clockwise around the small pond. When you reach the North end of the pond, look for a trail and take the trail to the right. After a short distance take the trail to your left. About thirty feet before the third trail post, look for two small pine trees on the right side of the trail. The geocache is at the base of the two small pine trees. After finding the geocache, continue following the trail back to the parking area

(HIKE: 2 mile round trip)



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
