## DRIVING DIRECTIONS

From Lakeland, follow US92 east about 11 miles. Turn right on Havendale Blvd for 3.2 miles. Turn south on US17 then turn left on Ave B NW follow this road to the Winter Haven Library and park. The Library is located at 325 Ave A NW.



## THINGS TO SEE

Enjoy the top 10 winners of the Florida Outdoor Sculpture Competition installed in Central Park. Stop by the library where a downtown Florida-Friendly Landscaping Excursion begins! Ask for the self-guided plant tour map to explore the wonderful examples of Florida-Friendly plants and rain gardens installed in parks and public buildings along the southern Chain of Lakes Trail.

## FIND THE CACHE WITHOUT GPS:

Park and go north on the trail. Cross over Motor Pool Rd, 2nd Lake Ida St. and Hyland Ave. After crossing Hyland Ave. go approximately 700 feet and look for a large pine tree. The geocache can be found at the base. (Hike: 1.5 miles roundtrip)

## Chain of Lakes Trail

This 12' trail allows pedestrians and cyclists to see many of the parks, neighborhoods and businesses that Winter Haven has to offer. The trail is approximately 3.6 miles in length and is divided into two sections. The southern section starts in Central Park and travels north through Martin Luther King, Jr. Park on Lake Silver. The northern section of the trails crosses 17/92 to the Lake Alfred trails. Trail users can park at any of the municipal parking lots in the downtown area.
