

Mosaic Peace River Park

The original boardwalk consisted of 1782 linear feet. Today the boardwalk is a mile long. Restrooms, picnic pavilions, and ADA parking is located near the boardwalk. A portion of the boardwalk at the Peace River has handicap accessible viewing and fishing areas including six (6) viewing areas and benches.

FIND THE CACHE WITHOUT GPS:

Follow signs to parking at top of the hill. Walk down the parking entry road and through the two picnic tables until you reach the boardwalk. Continue walking along the boardwalk

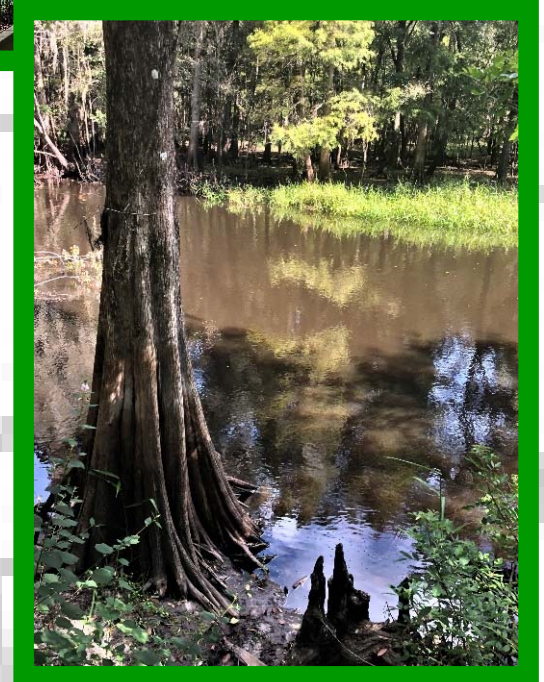
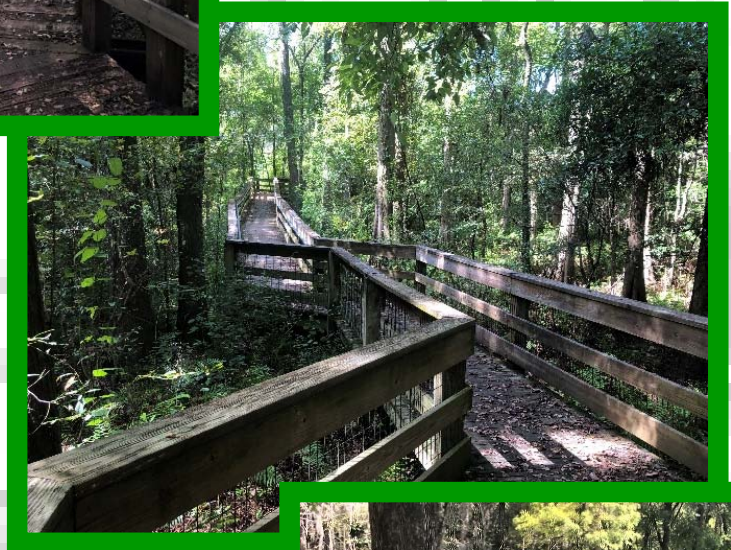
until you reach an intersection with benches in the middle. Turn left (north) and continue walking until you reach a "T" in the boardwalk. Turn left (west) to continue. If you want to view the river turn right at the "T". Continue walking along the boardwalk until you reach the paved road. Turn right (north) and follow the chain link fence to the first walk-through. There is a large oak tree with a pine growing in the middle about 80 feet from the fence. The cache is at the base of the pine inside the oak canopy. After finding the geocache

follow the paved road up the hill to the parking area.

(HIKE: 1.25 mile loop)

THINGS TO SEE

Enjoy scenic vistas from the boardwalk that winds through the floodplain to the river. See wildflowers, air plants, and wildlife. Learn about the Peace River ecosystem from the educational signs posted along the way funded by the Friends of the Park Foundation and the Charlotte Harbor Natural Estuary Program. Stop and listen to the wind blowing through the tall trees.
