FIND CACHE WITHOUT GPS:

Park at the Welcome Center Parking lot. From the parking lot walk to the Hollis Family Welcome Center and enter the AgAmerica Heritage Gardens. Follow the Oak Grove Trail under the lighted arches to the Circulator. Cross the Circulator and enter the Crenshaw Canopy Walk. Follow the holiday path until you reach the Allen and Company Family Lawn. You will be facing the Christmas tree on the lawn. Where the sidewalk path divides, look to the right for a group of pine trees. Return to the lawn and then turn right at the Florida Children's Museum. Take the Circulator back to the Welcome Center.

(HIKE: 0.75 mile round trip)
